- Janet: Project funding goals are in the agenda. Please read the attached goals.
- The survey results: the majority support goals 1 and 2, the accessible swing and projectors. Everyone had a chance to provide feedback and there were a ton of suggestions. Some were not PAC-related, some are happening already. We'll go ahead with our two goals. The majority are in favour. Parent: Did we actually get the quote now for accessible swing? Mr. Gurney: he's coming back with two scenarios. Haven't got it yet. We're also getting another company to come out. Ballpark figures are \$40,000 to \$50,000 for one option, \$60,000 to \$70,000 for the other. A lot of space is needed, about 10 metres in every direction. We may have to move the other swingset. We're trying to figure out what we can do with space.

 years in advance for grant applications. Looking into the city grant.

Garden Club -

- Continuing to meet until first week of December
- Focus has been on putting the garden to bed, covering with a layer of leaf mulch, planting garlic and preparing for winter
- Students are now meeting indoors to create bird feeders and craft cards for a local non
 profit, Beauty Night Society using a variety of leaves found around the school and as a way
 for the students to share their messages of hope
- A 3rd compost (same structure as the other 2 we currently have) has been donated by a family from Garden Club

Seed to Table Classes

• Will begin again in later January with a focus on creating intentions and visioning, seed inventory and garden planning

After School Cooking Classes

- A set of 15 students from the Advanced Classes have been asked to return with 7 students so far registering
- These are paid classes offered to Gr. 5 to 7 students who have already been part of the program
- When an appropriate Chef Assistant has been sourced, there will be consideration to expand the program to beginners
